Our Holiday Reception will take place at the historic Doheny property featured in our Inaugural Home Tour held on October 29, 2000. As announced in the October 25, 2024, *Dana Point Times*, owner Steven Abraham has placed his “Historic 95-year-old Home for Sale in Capistrano Beach.” Not only was this Palisades home the signature house of our first home tour, it also served as the tour headquarters for the six Doheny Homes on that tour and was again the headquarters for the Fourth Annual Home Tour in 2003. Then owners Don Burnes and his wife Alice Baum, who were Dana Point Historical Society Board members, thought a tour of historic homes could interest the public in preserving other historic homes. Their goal has been realized as more owners of historic buildings in Dana Point have applied for inclusion on the Historic Register. Currently, a Doheny home on Beach Road was just approved by the Planning Commission for the Historic Resources Register, a historic Woodruff home on El Camino Capistrano is being restored and the new El Caminante Bar & Bungalows is a restored historic motel we were invited to tour last July at the official ribbon-cutting event.

Steven Abraham is our holiday host on December 8, and the owner (since 2012) when his Doheny home was on our Fifteenth Home tour. He enjoys researching the home’s history and that of Edward L. “Ned” Doheny Jr., who developed Capistrano Beach in the 1920s. Our 2015 tour program states that the home has doubled in size since it was originally built. “The original part of the house is to the left of the entrance. The wall to the right of the staircase was the original exterior wall of the house. The wrought iron banister is original as are the hand-stenciled beams and stucco lattice work in the living room.” Docents will lead tours through the home and describe Steven’s restoration and improvements, and he will be there to answer your questions.

This is the time of year for me to express my thanks for our Board of Directors and Chairs who do so much to move the Historical Society forward while keeping the museum open for research and visitors. We have taken our DPHS Booth to the September Maritime Festival and the Fall Redo Market, the October ArtFest and November’s “The Big One” in La Plaza. Patrons’ hand-painted tiles will become part of local history when installed at the Baby Beach Tile Wall this month. My heartfelt thanks go to all our docents, booth volunteers and members whose support is vital to guarantee the Historical Society is here for the future while we share and preserve our artifacts, books and historic photos from the past.

I look forward to toasting the Holidays with you on Sunday, December 8th. Dress warmly, if the weather is cool, as the reception is outside. Beach Road Residence Registers as Historic Property



The 1920s Doheny home located at 35145 Beach Road has been unanimously approved by the City of Dana Point Planning Commission for placement on the Dana Point Historic Resources Register. The Commission also recommended the City Council authorize an agreement for participation in the Mills Act Program which allows local governments to enter into contracts with owners of qualified historic properties who participate in the restoration and maintenance of their historic properties while receiving property tax relief. This property is the 44th addition to the Dana Point Historic Register since the enactment of

the Historic Resources Ordinance in March 2001. “The Dana Point Historic Resources Inventory identified 75 structures (60 residential and 15 commercial) that met the established criteria, and which could then become candidates for historic designation.” (Planning Commission Agenda, Oct. 28, 2024) City designation of locally significant structures is the first step in applying for California and National recognition.
