DPHS Celebrates Keith Johannes As Founders Day Honoree on September 10



The Dana Point Historical Society will honor our society's Preservation Chair, Keith Johannes, as our 2025 Founders Day Award recipient. Doors will open at 5:30 p.m. and our presentation will begin at 6 p.m. A reception will follow in our museum.

This award was begun in 2002 to honor residents of Dana Point who have made significant contributions to the community during their lifetimes --- contributions that improve the city and the life of those who live here and are part of its ongoing history. Pioneers of the incorporation of the city have been honored, as well as those contributing to its cultural life, city government, business, various boards and commissions and supporters of clubs and nonprofit organizations in Dana Point.

Since becoming a resident of the City of Dana Point in 1969, Keith has been an active and involved leader in the preservation and renovation of historical homes and buildings within Dana Point. His understanding and use of the Mills Act regarding historic structures has enabled the City of Dana Point to preserve such key places as Pines Park, the Palisades Gazebo, the Doheny House and the Seaside Inn. Many of these preservations involved legal proceedings, some of which were adjudicated at the California Supreme Court level. Moreover, his active and involved presence at City Council meetings, notable academic societies, preservationist gatherings as well as cultural events throughout Orange County is noteworthy. His promotion of the unique culture and identity of our wonderful city has resulted in Keith speaking to neighboring cities and communities as well as being an insightful participant in the Orange County Historical Society. Further, his knowledge of the local community and the process necessary to preserve and promote bygone architectural relics such as the original lanterns adjacent to Pines Park and the remnants of the Dana Point Inn has helped ensure our city retain its unique and stalwart identity. It is the Dana Point Historical Society's great pleasure to present the 2025 Founders Award to Keith Johannes.
